预修要求：本课程阅读材料为定量研究风格，故预选课/旁听学生应学习过基本统计知识；由于多数阅读材料为英文阅读材料，学生应具备基础英文阅读能力。

一、课程简介

本课程为专题研讨，通过阅读经典与前沿文献，以理解社会分层的不同方式。具体分层主题涉及：性别、家庭、族群和族裔、阶层、社会资本、社会网络、教育、年龄、健康和疾病、中国当代社会分层、及区域比较等。本课程将涉及多种社会分层方式在微观、中观、及宏观层次的形塑过程，不同理论视角对社会分层的理解，社会分层的多样影响，以及社会分层与社会不平等的关系。

本课程视角之一为 Intersectionality Perspective，即认为各分层主题不应被割裂开来单独分析，因此所选阅读材料会看到不同主题的相互交叉与联结。本课程将提升学生社会分层的意识，了解社会分层对当代社会资源分配与生活机会的影响。

In this course, we will develop a familiarity with the major theoretical perspectives in social division/ stratification and explore recent research in this area. Major division/ stratification themes in this course involve gender, family, race/ethnicity, class, social capital, social network, education, age, health and illness, global inequality, and social stratification in China. We will attend to the intersectionality of different ways and types of social divisions. Through this course, we continue to work on developing our ability to think critically, independently, and creatively. Hopefully, we will advance our research at the end of this semester.
